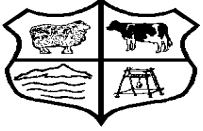

Banana Scream

Summer Recipe 4

Try these **Banana Scream** to keep you cool over summer! (serves 4)

Ingredients:

- 3 bananas (riper bananas make sweeter shakes)
- 2 tbsp non-fat milk



Method:

1. Peel the bananas, cut in half width-wise, wrap in plastic wrap and freeze until firm.
2. Place in a blender, add milk and puree until creamy.
3. Place in a small cup to serve or re-freeze in paper cup liners until ready to eat
